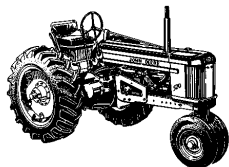

Doug Smith, Whatcom County Heritage Farmer

Doug Smith got his first taste of baling hay at age 13 and has been making hay ever since. Doug grew up in Whatcom County near Bellingham and helped his father at an early age with a custom hay business. Doug's father made his living operating a crane for the Olympic Portland Cement plant outside of Bellingham from 1928 to 1968. In 1942, his father starting farming on the side as an avocation. He did custom work and made hay on summer evenings after work and weekends with the help from Doug, his brother and his co-workers. The hobby grew to 1000 acres of hay and custom work with three balers and six small to mid-size tractors at it's peak . The poorer grade hay was fed to a herd of 250 beef cattle and the higher quality hay was sold. Doug's farming heritage runs deep as his great grandfather brought his first herd of cattle to Whatcom County in 1885 and, in 1889, settled on a small Axton road farm.

Doug graduated from Western Washington University and the University of Washington with a mechanical engineering degree. For 11 years, he worked for the Mobil Refinery near Ferndale as an engineer and for the next 16 years, worked as a professional for Anvil Corporation. After "retiring" from Anvil Corporation, Doug and his wife operated an engineering, design and construction business for another 16 years. Doug is proud to report that he is currently serving his fourth term as a Port of Bellingham Commissioner.

In 1981, Doug had acquired 60 acres north of Ferndale which he farmed and eventually sold. He has 6 acres inside the city limits of Bellingham which he keeps him in the hay-ing business. Doug says his wife is a city

kid but does enjoy the tractors and farming activities. She supports his tractor club activities and wouldn't participate if she didn't enjoy it.

Current tractors include at 1955 Massey Ferguson model 35 which his father bought new and a John Deere 720 diesel which Doug uses for the annual club caravan and parades. He likes the Deere best because it has more character than other tractors. Spectators respond to the JD because of its large size, snappy color and the distinctive two cylinder sound. Doug bought the model 720 diesel about 20 years ago in Pasco, Washington from George Nagasaka. The tractor had been overhauled at the time and was free of the usual Puget Sound rust. Doug enjoys explaining to non-farming people what the tractor can do and the era it represents. A carrier box on the back of the Deere has been constructed so the four grand children can ride in parades. His three daughters aren't too interested in tractors but the grandkids really enjoys grandpa's big green and yellow tractor. Both the Massey Ferguson and the 720 John Deere are restored but are used for work. Doug does all the maintenance himself from overhaul to painting. Of all the agriculture equipment Doug has owned he has never hired anyone else to do the maintenance work! There is a certain pride in doing it all yourself. Our summer caravan will be July 21 on Fir Island loop with a picnic lunch. We will have more details in the June newsletter.

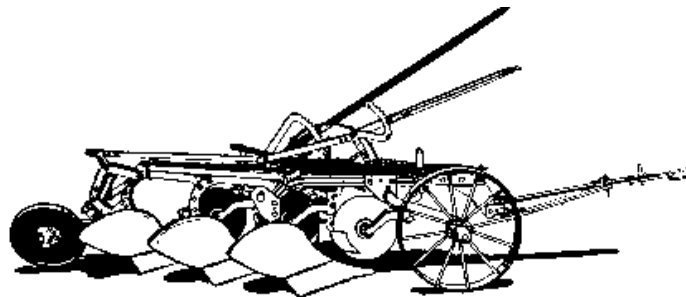
