Scott McAbee, Marysville Restorer and Collector

Scott is not a farm boy but grew up in the Shoreline district of Seattle. Maybe he got his early interest in tractors when he learned to drive on his great grandfather's 1973 Simplicity garden tractor. Those early fun moments can last a life time. The first restoration started in 1998 when Scott purchased a hand start Lindeman BO crawler from his neighbor. This little crawler was extra special in that it also included a Lindeman orchard trailer. This trailer was made of wood except for the metal tongue and 9" tires. The trailer was designed to hold four apple boxes. Scott didn't have a shop then so the complete restoration process was done outside. Scott noted that the Lindeman had a home made blade which he promptly discarded. Most Lindeman BO crawlers that were sold with a Lindeman blade usually developed final drive casting cracks. Not so with this crawler.

Being a bus garage shop foreman for Stanwood Schools, Scott has no problems with the mechanical side of restoring. He also has become very accomplished at the metal bending, metal prep and painting process. Scott used John Deere paint which he learned later reduced the value of the restoration. Some feel that the Deere paint doesn't last as long as automotive finishes.

By 1999 the crawler and trailer were completed and Scott and wife Kim hit the tractor show circuit covering eight states in 37 days. By the end of the summer the Lindeman and trailer were sold to a rancher in Nebraska, but Scott still entertains thoughts of buying it back someday. After the crawler Scott found a project 1957 John Deere 820 in Linton, North Dakota. You may have seen this fine restoration at one of the Stanwood Harvest Jubilees. Another Scott restoration is a 1952 John Deere AR. This tractor has been shown at Stanwood, Brooks, Carnation and resides at Monroe. A 1926 John Deere D and Farmall B(Kim's grandfather tractor) are on the list for being restored. Scott lives on a 1/4 acre of land so most of the completed projects are exhibited elsewhere. Scott has painted a Minneapolis Moline and numerous John Deere tractors. Scott notes that he has been asked to do restorations but his concern is that he wants to keep the hobby fun! Restoring other people's tractors could turn into work. Like any artist, Scott has developed a signature marking on all his projects. He paints a signature bolt a different color and hides it on the tractor.

Some where in the line of tractor restorations Scott thought that he would like

PSAT&MA Show, August 1-4



to restore his Great Grandfathers old Simplicity garden tractor. As luck would have it the little tractor was still owned by a cousin. Unfortunately the tractor was in very poor condition and it was two years before enough enthusiasm was developed to restore the tractor. An example of Scott's dedication to detail involves "rubbing" the old Simplicity decals with paper and sending to Travis Jorde for an accurate reproduction decal. The Simplicity garden tractor is another complete restoration.

If you have been to any of the local shows this summer you should have seen the double D tractors or tractor. Whatcom county club member Ralph Heerspink has the double Rs and now Scott has the double Ds. This is Scott latest and perhaps most challenging projects to date. The double Ds were purchased several years ago at the famous Louie Toay's auction located near Wolf Point, Montana. 326 John Deere Ds were sold and the double Ds were one of them. Scott did the bid over the phone and he was surprised to call several days later to learn that he had the winning bid. A non stop trip to Wolf Point Montana in his one ton Dodge and 24' trailer and he was ready to load the treasures. When first seeing the tractors, Scott thought he had bought "yard art". In the process of loading the beasts onto his trailer he learned from one of the onlookers that he got the best deal in the auction! The tractors were sold out of order with the other Ds and other potential bidders lost out! Once back to Northwest Washington, the next step was planning the big restoration of two styled Ds connected together. Since Scott worked for Stanwood Schools he was aware of the high school agriculture mechanics class taught by Daryl Main. The plan was made for the students to do the work under the supervision of Mr. Main, a volunteer Mr. Buse and Scott. The project started in November and was completed in April of the following year. The tractors had sat for 15 years so much work was needed. The rear D was moved to the front and three parts Ds were used to rebuild a new rear D. The students did the bulk of the work including painting under the direction of Scott and Daryl Main. Scott paid for parts, supplies and made a cash donation to the school FFA chapter. Scott researched the origins of the double Ds and learned that two sets were made in 1966 in Ox Bow, Saskatchewan. The double Ds could pull two four bottom plows or a 26' chisel plow. The other mate to Scott's tractors is owned by a 80 year old man in Bowbell, North Dakota. Scott was able to meet with the owner of the second set and talk about the history and obtain information on them. The other set is farm fresh.

What's next? Well, Scott recently purchased a John Deere 5010 off Craigs List in Sheraton, Wyoming. It's the 28th 5010 off the assembly line and Scott is now doing the mechanical work. A tip of the green and yellow hat to Scott McAbee, our Fall 2012 featured member.


