## On the Road Again

### 2014 Edition


This year our RV (recreational vehicle) members decided it was time again to revisit the annual Old Thresher's Reunion in Mount Pleasant, Iowa. Paul and Jan Hieb, Phil Smoots and Janice Lisherness, Gary and Donna Friend left Skagit Valley on August 22 and met Jim and Cheryl Rowland that night in Pendleton, Oregon for their seven day trek to south east Iowa. The scenic trip east on highway I-80 had them camping at Boise Idaho, Ogden Utah, Rawlins Wyoming, North Platte Nebraska, Avaco Iowa and finally Mount Pleasant Iowa. Unlike four years ago, the field dedicated to rvs was very wet due to a previous 7 days of rain. Not wanting to risk getting Paul's RV coach dirty, the group decided to camp at the local Mount Pleasant Wal-Mart parking lot. After three days of taking in the Old Thresher's Reunion antique equipment, cars, trucks, tractors and 75 steam tractors the group was on to Jefferson City, Missouri. Branson Missouri was the next stop for five days. Branson is famous for entertainment and not much else since the county is so rocky it can't grow trees. Phil says that this land is a far cry from northern Missouri which is green and very agriculturally rich like Iowa. The Branson's shows were great with the group taking in two shows a day for four days.

Our group took a side trip to the College of the Ozarks which is near Branson. The school is also known as Hard work U because students are required to work at the school while attending classes. The students benefit by not paying tuition but only pay for room and meals. No college loans needed! The four year school has a farm which produces dairy items, pork and beef.

Students are the labor for this and the school has a restaurant which is student operated. School fruit cakes are another big money raiser and of course are baked and packaged by the students. The student enrollment is 1500 and accepts only one in 20 students applying for admission.

Before moving on Phil and Janice took a side trip to Arkansas so Janice could ride her touring bike bagging another state to her resume. Next on the trip was a stop at a small antique tractor show in Boonesville Missouri. Gary and Donna Friend departed the caravan and continued east to Gettysburg Pennsylvania for a family reunion. The remaining three couples continued to Red Oak Iowa and then to Orange City to visit Jake Rens. The Rens are originally from Oregon and relocated to Iowa a few years back to build their dream home and shop on a hill with a great panoramic view of the Iowa farm land. Did you know that Iowa farmed 14.6 million acres of corn in 2012? Jake's shop is 60 feet by 100 feet and filled with over 40 collector tractors with some quite rare. Jake is one of most knowledgeable two cylinder collectors and was recently mentioned in the Two Cylinder Magazine. A stop was made at Spencer Iowa which is home to the Clay County Fair which is acclaimed to be the greatest county fair in the United States with 300,000 attendees. Spencer is also home to Roberts Carburetors. The caravan made a stop at Mitchell South Dakota to tour the Corn Palace which was unfortunately closed for remodeling. On the way home our group experienced 4 inches of snow in the morning at Sheridan Wyoming

### *August 23 Morrison Farms Plow Day*

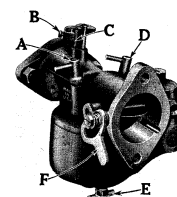
Over 300 people attended this one day event. Many tractors were plowing this year with a large potluck dinner following the exhibition.

**Treasurers Report \$5606.05 on hand**

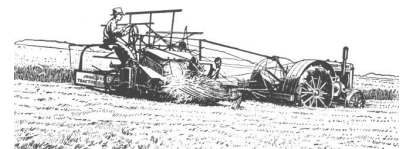
