Steve Ebe, California member with a Northwest Beginning

Steve Ebe lives near Millville, Northern California which is about 800 miles from Lynden or a 15 hour drive. Like our other long distance Cascade Two Cylinder Club members, Steve has a special connection to the Northwest.

Steve grew up in a Whatcom County potato farming family started by his grandfather Oscar Ebe in the early 1920's. Oscar immigrated to the United States from Germany in 1914 and was the first to grow certified seed potatoes in Whatcom County. Steve's dad Aloys Ebe and Uncle Leonard continued the potato business and Steve's cousin Greg currently runs the potato operation. Uncle Leonard just turned 90 years of age recently and Steve drove up from Millville for his birthday celebration in early October. After high school, Steve attended Washington State University where he earned a degree in agricultural engineering. Steve's career took him in a different direction than the family farm but he has many special memories of the early years.

Early Tractor Fascination

Steve has a photo of his grandfather holding him on a D2 Caterpillar in 1950. There are also two John Deere A's in the picture. This was the extent of tractor power on the Ebe farm at that time. Steve's friends kid him about that being the start of his tractor affection. He was 18 months old at that time. Steve's first experience driving a tractor was the D2 Caterpillar pulling a John Deere single axle tilt bed trailer. Steve's dad and uncle were picking up sticks on a newly cleared field

and Steve's job was to pull the clutch back when told to stop. That was a very special responsibility for a little kid. The Caterpillar and John Deeres were all purchased at North Washington Implement. At that time the Deere dealerships also sold Caterpillars. Another early tractor memory was Steve winning a John Deere 40 crawler toy at a John Deere Day in Lynden. The North Washington dealership owner at that time, John Spaan called Steve to the stage to present the toy. Boy, was that a moment to remember! Steve now has about 75 John Deere toys in his collection. Any time a new detailed two cylinder toy is available, Steve will add it to his collection.

Full size Deeres

He is the executor of his parents estate which contains 21 tractors which are mostly complete(not running) but not restored. Most of tractors are Deere with a few others and some are not complete. All of the tractors are still in the northwest. Steve won't have a lot of tractors in his collection because he just doesn't have the room.

His California big tractor collection contains a restored 1937 John Deere Model B(row crop), a 1957 John Deere 420 crawler with Holt blade and a 1931 Caterpillar Model 10. The 1937 Model was restored by his dad about 25 years ago. Steve exhibited this tractor at the Puget Sound Antique Tractor and Machinery Show this last August. He also owns a 1958 John Deere 720 electric start diesel (wide front, row-crop) with his friend Dax Kimmelshue. The dilemma is that if you restore a tractor you hate to take it out and get it dirty. President's Message


