

On the Road Again 2016!

This September we had another group of C2CC members RV to the mid west to attend several tractors shows, museums and the Branson Missouri entertainment mecca. The Hiebs and Rowlands left first on September 9 to visit an aging uncle and aunt in the Sand Point Idaho area. While in the area they attended the Spokane Fair.

The Jensens, Brinson, Smoots and Friends left on September 13 to rendezvous with the Hiebs and Rowlands in Pendleton Oregon. With the Pendleton Round Up in town the group "overnighted it" at the Wild Horse Casino. Free camping and cheap food!

The group's plan was to attend the National Two Cylinder Tractor show in Fairview Oklahoma. After Salt Lake City the boys decided to attend the York Nebraska tractor show on Sept 18. This two day show was about one third the size of the Lynden P.S.A.T&M.S. show. Show grounds included a restored church and farm stead. Plowing and other field work was displayed.

A slight misstep occurred in Idaho for Tom and Judy when their motor home developed an oil leak. This was quickly repaired but put the Jensens a day or two behind the rest of the campers. The Jensens met up with Jim and Hilda Sorensen for one night in Ogden Utah who were on their way to visit relatives in Kentucky. They were able to tour the Union Station Railroad Museum which was the most popular railway station in the USA until the 1950s. On the road again, the Jensens saw a herd of 600 bisons. Arches National Park in southern Utah, Gunnison Colorado with yellow Aspen trees and the 11,300 foot Continental Divide. They enjoyed Old Bents Fort National Historical site with early fur trapper reenactment and then on to Dodge City Kansas and the famous Boot Hill cemetery. Finally the Jensens reached Edin Oklahoma RV park where they met up with the rest of the C2CC travelers. The National Two Cylinder Tractor

Show at last. The Fairview Oklahoma two day show was a little smaller than the Lynden Puget Sound Antique Tractor & Machinery show and featured around 40 nice John Deeres. Other brands of tractors were also displayed. The show grounds contained several quality museums, some steam equipment and a threshing event. Being billed as the National Two Cylinder Tractor show disappointed Paul.

Branson Missouri was the next destination where the group stayed six nights and took in 11 shows. Everyone liked the Branson entertainment. Nearby was the College of the Ozarks where tours were given of the college and the working farms. Students work off their tuitions and costs by working in food service, dairy, beef, and the hog farm. The girls do all the milking at the dairy. Every RV trip seems to include a few mechanical problems and it seemed that each unit had some. There was the Jensens oil leak. The Hiebs had an air conditioner malfunction. The Friends lost a trailer wheel. The Bershaurers fifth wheel got side swiped by a truck and the Brinsons had a door latch problem. Since these were skilled and talented tractor people all problems were quickly solved with their chins held high! After Branson, the Berschauers were off to Indiana to get the trailer repaired. The Jensens were off to Iowa to see the toy museum in Dyersville and the new John Deere museum in Waterloo. Travis Jorde's oldest known Waterloo Boy was there along with Walter Keller's first serial number JD 3010. With nasty head colds the Jensens headed west to the good ole Skagit Valley. The rest of the group headed west with the Friends staying in Idaho for two days and the Smoots, Hiebs and Rowlands heading home as fast as possible. Paul and Jan's motorhome logged 5,163 mostly fun filled miles and were home on October 8th.

100 Year Anniversary 2017 Washington Tractor—Lynden (North Washington Implement)


Jim Hale, Washington Tractor wants to do something really special since it is the 100 year anniversary of the Lynden John Deere dealership.

Our C2CC board members, officers and representatives from the PSAT&MA club met with Mr. Hale on November 3 to discuss possibilities to celebrate the North Washington Implement centennial.

Jim Hale wants to feature a old fashion John Deere Day in June and he is also thinking about a special display following the June Lynden Farmers Day Parade. An emphasis will be placed on displaying tractors and implements sold by North Washington Implement during the 100 years. This includes tractors and equipment newer than the two cylinder age. Tractors need not be restored but should be in presentable condition. Mr. Hale stated that there are very few Deere dealerships remaining in the United States that have been operating for 100 years. Did you know that North Washington sold a new Rumely in 1936? Caterpillar was also sold and one of our members may display one.

For our club, the focus will be on the August PSAT&MA show displaying as many tractors, implements, bikes, wagons, lawn mowers and memorabilia as possible. Loren Van Beek and family have volunteered to be the PSAT&MA show director. Special seminars may be scheduled and Washington Tractor may sell John Deere toys in our John Deere building. All tractor clubs in Washington, Oregon and B.C. will be encouraged to attend. This could be the biggest display of classic John Deeres yet! A barbeque potluck dinner hosted by Washington Tractor will be provided to exhibitors and John Deere employees during the show. Special hats, buttons and exhibitor plaques will be available next year. Washington Tractor will be doing special event advertising through out the year.


