John Maas-Tractor Whisperer

John was born in New Holland, S. Dakota but grew up in Corsica, a few miles a way. John's father was a blacksmith and starting John welding when he was 8 years old. Most of the shop work was reforming and sharpening plow shares for the local farm community. In 1954, John and several friends entered on a road trip to Lynden, Washington. It took three weeks to make the trip after much sightseeing on the way. John liked the climate in Whatcom county and didn't like the coal dust in the South Dakota blacksmith shop so the next year John decided to move to the Lynden area. One of John's uncles in Lynden encouraged him to get a job in a local machine shop fabricating carrot diggers for the Kelly Farquhar vegetable processing cannery. During a coffee break at the Lynden Recreation Bar & Grill John met John Spaan who was the manager/owner of the local John Deere dealer North Washington Implement. Mr. Spaan invited 19 year old John to come work at North Washington Implement in the shop with a promise to eventually work him into a sales position. John worked in the shop for one year under the excellent guidance and mentoring of shop foreman Joe Cramer. During this time John attend several John Deere service schools receiving top scores. Mr. Spaan wanted John to transfer to sales but John explained to him that he really enjoyed working on the Deeres and that it was either the shop or the highway. John was able to stay in the shop and continued with more Deere service schools in Portland Oregon. In 1962, shop foreman Joe Cramer left for a job at the local Darigold plant and John was promoted to shop foreman. John stayed with North Washington Implement until it was sold in 1967. During this time John was able to hone his skills on the two cylinder tractors and experience the New Generation Deeres that replaced the Johnny Poppers.

John proudly stated that North Washington was the only shop in Whatcom county that had a dynometer and mass meter(fuel meter). With these two test units the two cylinder tractors could be finely tuned. John liked the two cylinder engines better that the New Generation engines because of the durability, low end torque and ability to tune for maximum horsepower and fuel efficiency. After leaving North Washington in 1967, John moved to a mechanics job at Intalco. John continued with Intalco until retirement in 1998. When he started at Intalco, he was the only mechanic out of six that had experience working on diesel engines. Some of the equipment had Detroit diesel 253 engines which were the same as the John Deere 435 two cylinder tractor engine. John's dad had taught him early how to improve the design of equipment which skill was valuable at Intalco. John was able to take the John Deere designs and modify them into the equipment at Intalco. One example was an equipment modified brake system that improved the cost of maintenance from \$6000 a year to \$200. Intalco had a bonus program to reward employees who saved the company money. In John's tenure at Intalco he was able to earn \$4000 in bonuses for cost saving equipment modifications. John can't give enough credit to his dad who taught him welding and how to improve designs of equipment. John also appreciated Joe Cramer's mentoring during the early days at North Washington Implement.

John owns a 1964 John Deere 110 lawn tractor but has never owned a tractor. If he did it would be a John Deere G because of it's awe-some torque and horsepower. John really enjoys working on the club members two cylinder tractors from the John Deere L to the 830. The two cylinder club meetings are fun and he wants to continue helping the members with their tractors. John still gets calls from Wash-






