Cowboy Logic Saving by letting go Pasture antiquity heads to town By Ryan M. Taylor

TOWNER, N.D.-Growing up, most of our pastures had herds of cattle or a small band of horses on them. But one small pasture, close to home, was occupied by old steel and antique iron. It was a little boy's imagination playland better than most manufactured specifically to amuse.

My pasture playland had old horse drawn equipment, antique cars and tractors and even a jeep. All manner of things for a kid to sit on, steer, shift and pretend they're doing something grand in their little mind of make believe.

I was always particularly drawn to one large old hunk of iron with pulleys and gears and fly wheels as big across as I was tall. The one big wheel could be turned which turned another gear and another with teeth and cogs which drove a plunger of sorts, but it was pretty slow motion. Dad always warned me not to stick a finger in there, and I never did.

The machine was an old stationary hay baler. It used to sit out in the hayfield, a natural resting spot for old stationary hay equipment, but Dad pulled it up closer to the yard, much to my satisfaction as it completed my playground line up of horse mowers, horse rakes, cultivators, binders and planters.

I knew it was old, but I never knew a lot about its origin. I think it was originally owned by another old homesteading neighbor to bale hay on our shared hay meadow. The only reason to put hay in little square bales in those days was to make it possible to load a rail box car to the max and ship it somewhere to sell at a better price.

Fellow baler

I did hear stories of another stationary baler in our family, on my mother's side, that I always found interesting. Her uncles had one that they bought second hand in 1912 from a local fellow who had shipped the baler off to Yakima, Wash., by rail where it was set to use baling hay.

And some of the hay it baled was shipped to Hawaii to feed the horses and mules that powered the pile drivers that built Pearl Harbor. The baler came back to North Dakota and was bought by her uncles to bale hay out of the stacks made on the Mouse River meadow.

A little brush with destiny in a very round about way, but still a story worth telling. Better yet, the baler was made by the Sandwich Manufacturing Company of Sandwich, Illinois. Yup, and the baler had been to Hawaii which was once called what? The Sandwich Islands. Destiny.

Renewal and preservation

I've always wanted to see our old baler work, but never seemed to have the time or talent to get it back in working order. So I pitched the idea to a friend with a local threshing show who had an affinity for fixing up old farm implements.

Last week, we loaded up the old baler on a trailer and donated it to the Drake Threshing Show. I hope they can save it for posterity and someday put on an old fashioned hay baling demonstration for old timers and kids and old time kids like me at the Drake Threshing Show.

As we pulled that baler away from its resting spot, I felt good knowing it wouldn't be melted down for scrap, it won't go unappreciated and sink into the sod, and

Please Note! C2CC Event Insurance Clarification

The Cascade Two Cylinder Club has liability insur-

ance that covers our members at **approved**(sanctioned) events such as parades, shows and our caravan. The club events listed on page 6 of this newsletter are official C2CC insured events. **This insurance does not cover you and your tractor traveling to and from the event**. For the club activity to be insured, our treasurer, Tom Jensen must notify our insurance agent of the event, date and location. Most events require a letter from our insurance agent verifying insurance coverage for our members and tractors at the event. If you wish to be insured at an event not listed please contact Tom Jensen or Paul Hieb.

Ethanol Update

We have been informed that the local Union 76 stations in Skagit County are no longing providing ethanol free gasoline. To our knowledge the only ethanol free gasoline is available at the Skagit Farmers Supply Cenex Administration building, 1833 Park Avenue, Burlington. If not familiar with the site go north from Burlington on old 99 highway and turn right at the KIA dealership, go across the railroad tracks and take the first right. The self serve station is beyond the administration building. You can purchase fuel with a credit card but Bill Markus, Petroleum manger indicated that to get the discount price you need to have a Skagit Farmers Supply account and request a personal fuel card available in the main office. Please let us know if there are other fuel stations continuing to sell non ethanol gasoline.

There are still strong feelings that E10 fuel is harmful to our old engines and small gas engines. Our newer cars and trucks have no problems with the new fuels.

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




