

Coming back to Lynden he started at North Washington Implement installing Delaval milking equipment in 1978.

President's Message







100th Anniversary of the Model D John Deere Noteworthy Facts (continued from Winter newsletter)

The "D" had a 30 year production run which started in 1923 and ended in 1953. This was the longest run of any Deere to date. 158,308 "Ds" were produced. 111,386 unstyled and 46,922 styled. 1935 brought the 3 speed transmission that could travel 5 miles per hour. The DI was offered with a higher speed final drive, industrial style seat and individual turning brakes. The tires were hard rubber. In 1936 the ag "D" offered turning brakes on rubber tire option. 1937 "D" changed radiator curtain to a shutter.1939 brought big changes with the Dreyfuss styled "D" available mid year. Electric start option was available as electric lights were available years earlier. The drawbar horse power increased to 38 with the belt remaining the same. 1941 tractor had rubber tires standard but changed back to steel during the war. The introduction of the "R" sealed the fate of the "D". The "R" had 5 speed transmission, more hp, diesel economy, live hydraulics and live pto. 1951 "D" was designed to run on gasoline only which increased the hp for 10.

The 1952 production ceased with the last tractor built in March 25, 1953. Demand required 92 "D" being assembled in June and July in the street thus called "streeters". Tractors were assembled by hand from spare parts. The last tractors were hand start and most were shipped to the South where the "D" did better in the rice field mud then the "R".

In summary, the John Deere management was hesitant in getting into the tractor business. They had made a name for themselves with great implements. They made several attempt in the early 1900s without success. The Water Loo Boy developed by Water Loo Gasoline Engine Company was a good tractor but aging. Deere bought the company in 1918 and continued selling the tractor until 1922. The engineers at Water Loo had been developing a tractor like the "D" before the sale to Deere. With the engineering resources from both companies the 1923 "D" was born. With constant improvement the "D" survived the Big Depression and a World War .acj
