

The Old Model A that saved the Day

I think it was "The Fall of 1949", I was 13 years old. It was our Thrashing day at the farm. Old John Snow arrived with his big Rumely Tractor and his Massey Harris thrashing machine to contract the job. You could hear him coming a mile away with the crunching of the steel wheels on the gravel road and the explosions from the Old Rumely Tractor.

It never bothered old John as he was deaf as a stone Father always said. Father had to drive truck that day for Snyder Trucking Company so I was left in charge of our team of horses and wagon. Roy Petrie had his team and wagon. Mr. Appleyard had his John Deere A tractor and wagon. Thrashing began at 8 am Sharpe as old John demanded. So we could finish in time as he was thrashing at Dr. Roy Petrie's farm the next day.

I was on my second load of wheat sheaves at the separator and had just finished unloading when Old John signaled me to pump more kerosene into the Rumely from the 45 gallon drum on the ground. In a hurry and not thinking, I forgot to tie the reins to the front rack of the wagon. When I leaned down to do the pumping of Kerosene I heard the Rumely tractor let off a loud explosion that "spooked" my team of horses. The team took off with the empty wagon. I leaped aboard to take control but the reins were trailing on the ground so out the lane we headed. With me hollering "Whoa Whoa" you devils. Mr. Appleyard was about to enter the lane with a load of sheaves when he saw the runaway team and wagon and me hanging on for "Deere Life". He quickly throttled up the old "A" Model and blocked the lane with his wagon which stopped the

team without injury or serious damage to the wagon.

Mr. Thinker from the Green Magazine got the question concerning winterizing the fuel system in our gasoline tractors. His response was to follow the operator’s manual suggestion of draining all fuel from the system. Deere says that if you don’t you will get a gummy substance in the carburetor. Oh really! He says if you don’t want to do that then at least fill the tank, add stabilizer and drain the carb. and sediment bowl.

Need Special Fasteners in a Hurry?

Large local hardware stores handle many fastener needs but the unusual bolts and cap screws are hard to find. John Deere is one source for the Deere specific items. Fastenal can get many fasteners but they may need to be ordered. Tacoma Screw, located near the Burlington Harley Davidson dealer has a very large supply in stock. They claim to stock 80% of their catalog items. Their catalog is about 4 inches thick. They also don’t have a minimum order.

Another great source is Hardware Sales in Bellingham. If you have time, Correct Connections located in Rockport, PA has the square head bolts found on the old Deere tractors and equipment. They also sell the fastener kits for most two cylinder Deeres. What are your sources?


