John Deere Horse Drawn Implements

If you had the opportunity to see the John Deere replica dealership building you may have noticed the old Deere implements. Most of these were originally horse drawn Deere implements manufactured in the first half of the 20th century. By today's farming standards the implements are quite primitive, but in their day, they were a major work saver from tilling and planting the fields by hand.

The following is a brief description of the implements and their history leading to the John Deere dealership museum.

JD Sulky Plow Restored by Loren Dahl, Bow, WA

We don't have a date for this plow but a similar plow was called a New Deere light draft plow circa 1910. The plow is on loan by Bob Calhoun, Custer, WA. The plow originally was owned by Joe Wasky from Custer. Bob had tried to get the plow from his friend for many years but he wouldn't sell. After Joe passed on, Bob was able to get the plow from the estate. Bob feels that more people will see the plow in the JD museum than at his place. Loren Dahl started the project in April and finished for the 4th of July parade at Sedro Woolley. Harold Eastbury displayed the plow on the back of his truck during the parade. Some of the parts were fabricated by Loren and everything else was cleaned and painted.

JD Walking Plow

Owned by the late Gary Worline and given to Loren Dahl for restoration several years ago. No date has been established for vintage of this horse plow but Deere produced the plow from 1867 into the 1940's. Gary was reported to have purchased the plow at a local auction. Loren started and finished the plow project in 2008. The plow was cleaned, painted and new handles were installed.

JD Cultivator Future restoration to be done by Loren Dahl and Cliff Wright, Bow, WA

The story goes that it took one man and horse drawn cultivator 37 ½ days to cultivate 100 acres. A JD model A tractor and four row cultivator could do the job in 6 days. No vintage date on this cultivator but it is similar to a New Elk automatic cultivator made in 1910.

Bob Calhoun got this cultivator from a antique dealer friend in Iowa. Bob had bought a loan of antiques in the Midwest and the cultivator was placed on the load to Washington State. Loren Dahl and Cliff Wright will have the cultivator restored by the spring of 2010

JD Corn Planter

Owned by Maurice Beld's sister, Gladys Van Diest. Thanks to Maurice, the two row horse drawn John Deere planter was loaned to the museum. Originally, the planter was owned by Maurice's cousin in Lodge Pole South Dakota. The planter is dated to late 1920's or early 1930's. It is set up with the check wire planting system for easier plant cultivation. Maurice says that the planter is in very good original shape but with no original paint. The cousin was meticulous with all his equipment, storing inside when not being used on the farm. Maurice isn't sure if he will leave the planter in the good, original condition (official exhibitor classification) or paint it. The planter has a short, non original tongue and he hopes to find the original.

JD Model E Manure Spreader Restored by Bob Folk, Orcas Island, WA

This Skagit county implement was bought new at Barnett Implement, used two seasons, cleaned and put away for over 60 years. Bob found the spreader in a barn south of Mount Vernon and did the restoration. Called the "original low down spreader" by Deere, the implement was in good condition but Bob needed to do a complete paint job. With some major disassembly and painting the project took three years. When the restoration was completed Bob had the spreader "tested" out behind a pair of black Persheron draft horses owned by Jim and Chris Sesby of Friday Harbor. Spreader was built between 1932 and 1945. First displayed at the Anacortes Antique Machinery Show in Anacortes in September 2007.

I bought a couple of the NAPA 3039 fuel filters but learned quickly that they don't fit inside the Dubuque tractor(M, 40, 420 &430) sediment bowls. I do think they will fit in the larger sediment bowls on the Waterloo tractors(A,B,G,60,50,70 etc.). What's been your experience? *ajohnson*

(Continued from page 1, JD Horse implements) JD #2 High Lift mower Restored by Alerd Johnson Main frame of mower came from Eastern Washington and had minimal rust. I traded a JD #1 high lift mower for a #2 mower from club members Chuck and Flo Sayre, Pasco, WA. Chuck now has a complete set of John Deere horse mowers at his estate outside of Pasco. I also got some parts from club member Stan Coffman, Sedro Woolley. It took the winter of 2009 to disassemble, sandblast, unstuck shafts from bearings and paint the mower. Much more work than I expected but worth it. Parts book and operators books were easily accessible from Deere. I suspect the mower is from the early 1930's and like most horse mowers were converted from horse to a shorter tongue for tractors. One spectator at the 2009 Lynden show noted that he had mowed many acres with the mower and if a tractor was used instead of horses, one needed to keep the speed low to prevent heating up and destroying the bearings. Club member Clyde Caldwell, Mount Vernon submitted that he had lost the tip of his finger with a JD horse mower. He was trying to clear a plugged sickle with his finger when the horses relaxed causing the sickle to move slicing his finger.

Tools Explained Part 1
