


## 2009 Caravan

# Ralph Heerspink, Whatcom Collector

Ralph Heerspink has one of the more unusual tractor or tractors in the northwest. His double John Deere Rs or tandem Rs are perhaps the start of the four wheel drive tractor or articulated field tractor era

Ralph says that his Rs were fabricated together by a shop in Conrod, Montana. The front axles from both tractors were removed and the rear and front of the Rs where joined together. To his knowledge no special name was given to the conversion. 28 of the units were put together in the early 1960's. Ralph's tractors were both 1950 model Rs. Montana is wheat county and many new John Deere Rs were brought in to till the wheat ground. The R was a very successful tractor and what could be better than two Rs connected together dramatically increasing the traction and pulling power.

By the early 1960s, Rs were being traded in for the newer more powerful 820, 830s and the new generation tractors. With a surplus of used Rs why not try a different approach to power. Caterpillar tractors were common in wheat country but a rubber tired tractor was smoother and faster than tracks Plows and tilling implements could be "ganged up" or the larger crawler plows could be used.

The John Deere R combination weighs in at 21,000 lbs. with liquid in each of the four wheels. The size and weight requires a larger equipment trailer to move the tandem unit. Initially the dou-

ble Rs had ropes to control the hand clutches and throttle. They were modified by Pete Bouma, Ralph's father in law to include a hydraulic activated clutch and a cable controlled throttle.

Pete Bouma brought the Rs out from Montana in 1987 and eventually sold them to Ron Bennett. Ron in turn sold the tractors to Ralph in 2006. Ralph says that so far he has shown the tractors at the annual P.S.A.T.&M.A. show and runs them in the Lynden Farmer's Day parade. Considering the size of the tractors, Ralph has his hands full and is not quite ready to add other Deeres to his collection. Ralph keeps the R unit at his 3 acre farm on the King Tut Road. It shouldn't take Ralph long to plow his field! Ralph's goal for the near future is to show the tractors at other agriculture shows in the area. A tip of the green and yellow hat to our Summer 2009 C2CC featured member Ralph Heerspink. ajohnson.

Meeting Minutes


Cascade 2 Cylinder Club General Membership Meeting May 16, 2009 North Washington Implement
