

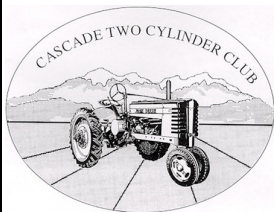

Dax Kimmelshue - Almonds, English Walnuts and John Deere Tractors

Dax has been collecting tractors, Deeres of course for 28 years. His dad got him started a few years before his death in 1990 and Dax has continued with the Green fever. Dax is a 5th generation farmer (3rd generation in California) and it's natural to enjoy classic tractors. Currently he has 12 restored with 12 in the "wings" waiting restoration but he really enjoys the originals also, if they are in good condition. Dax and his son Dustin are always on the lookout for the old Deeres and they have acquired enough tractors that have resulted in a salvage yard. Dax really enjoys helping people and being able to answer tractor questions and maybe providing original parts is an enjoyable part of the hobby. Dustin is the mechanic in the family and gained his knowledge with ag. mechanics in high school and welding and farm machinery training in the local community college. And of course there is the "on job training".

Dax's grandparents moved in 1951 from a farm in Illinois to escape the cold winters to Northern California. California has suited the Kimmelshues just fine. Currently Dax and his son in law farm 300 acres of trees (almonds and English walnuts) and 200 acres of dry edible beans. The beans are planted between the tree rows in a young orchard. During the busy time of year harvesting beans Dustin is called into duty driving grain cart but his real love is restoring tractors and keeping the farm's equipment operational.

Dax says that most of the collectors in the area have one or two tractors and he enjoys being a technical resource. Thru the

years he has picked up a lot of the old unstyled and styled letter and number model Deeres. He has had his share of As, Bs and G's and of course Ds, Hs and L's and LA's. Dustin does the mechanical necessities and metal work and Dax does the painting. One of the shows in the area is the Patrick Ranch Threshing Bee the first week in June. Keep in mind that in California, crops mature much earlier than in Northwest Washington. This is an active equipment show with threshing, field work and of course tractor pulls. Dustin has been very successful with a Lindeman John Deere crawler in pulling. Dax and friend Steve Ebe jointly own a John Deere 720 row crop which they "pull". Dax, Dustin and Steve are members of the Cascade Two Cylinder Club and brought their Deeres to the 2017 PSAT&MA show last year.

The John Deere BW 40 is Dax's rarest tractor and the one that he displayed at the Lynden show last year. Acquiring and restoring the BW40 is a story in its self. As far as a favorite tractor, he likes them all. There's not a John Deere that he doesn't like. Yes, he does have another green tractor that's not Deere. He has his uncle's 1938 Oliver "70" that will be restored someday. The tractor was bought by his grandfather new in 1938. It's in bad shape and will need some donor parts but it's doable. Dax's wife Karen is very supportive of the hobby and of course Dustin. We hope that the Kimmelshue's will attend another one of our shows in the near future. Treasurer's Report: Tom was absent but reported that we have \$4082.38 on hand . Hats for sale \$15

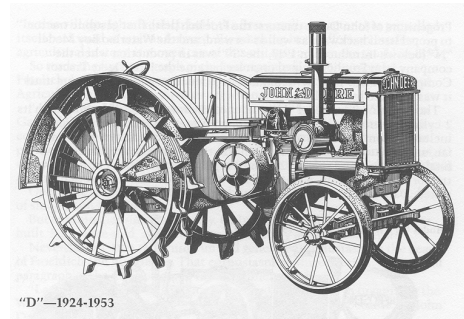

Separating the Chaff from the Grain

Anti freeze check time

Fall is here and it is time to prepare your treasured tractor(s) for the idle, cold winter months ahead. I hope by now that you have checked the anti freeze in your tractors. The experts say that anti freeze and water should be mixed before adding to an old Deere cooling system unless you are going to run the engine hot. The reason is that with the thermo siphoning system, the anti freeze and water don't mix very quickly like with a water pump cooling system. It is also recommended that the collector tractors be run hot during the winter season to get the oils moving around the engine and transmission and to "dry out" the internal parts. It's also nice to keep that \$80 plus 6 volt battery charged and maintained during the idle time of the year. Some say that all gas should be removed from the tank but others argue that the tank should be full to reduce moisture. Either way the carb. should be run dry. Non ethanol gas would be a good idea and maybe an Extend type of product to keep the gas fresh.

Future of the Sky Valley Show

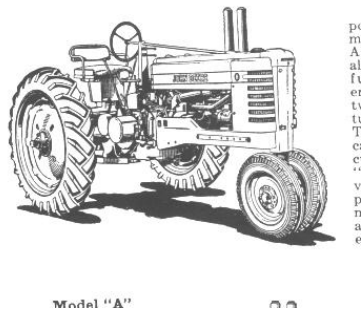
