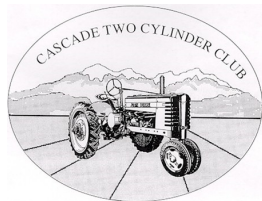

## Jim Hale— Ranching and Deeres

Jim grew up in West Seattle and graduated from Sealth High School. A friend of the Hale family owned a cattle ranch (100 head) near Wauconda, Washington. Wauconda is 1 hour and 20 minutes north east of Omak for geographic reference. The family trips to the ranch provided many pleasant memories including his first experience with a John Deere A. A picture of the A is in Jim's office at the Lynden dealership. Jim attended Yakima Junior College and transferred to Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo in California where he graduated in agriculture engineering. Jim went into college wanting to be a cattle rancher and came out wanting to be a John Deere dealer. The college program had a group of new tractors that the students could operate and the John Deeres were the most popular.

### The Career

After college, Jim started work as a sales trainee at Webb Tractor, a Deere dealer in Yakima. This was 1968 at the height of the Viet Nam war and Jim got his draft notice. Rather than being drafted, Jim joined the U.S. Air Force and went through the pilot training program. After his "hitch" with the Air Force, Jim went back to Yakima and the dealership, which was now Simcoe Equipment. He was now hired as an industrial equipment salesman.

The next stage in his life took Jim to Lynden High School as an Ag teacher in 1973. Lynden Schools failed their levy and Jim got his lay off notice in

1976. Needing a job, Jim was able to land a sales job at North Washington Implement in the NAPA store location. Realizing his life dream he was able to buy out co owner Bernice Telgenhoff in 1980. The other co owner, Howard DeGraff, died of a heart attack in 1990 and Jim became the owner of North Washington Implement. In 1992 Jim bought 15 acres off the Guide Meridian Highway which is the current store location. In 1997 Whatcom Transit Authority purchased the land around Deere dealership and in 1998 the current dealership facility was opened. In 2010 the merger of Washington Tractor dealerships occurred. Deere wanted larger and fewer dealerships. Currently Washington Tractor has 4 locations in Eastern Washington and 8 in Western Washington.

### Personal Tractor Stuff

Jim sold the last new 4020 in Washington State. He owns the spoked D that is one serial number away from Fred Polinder's JD D. John Spaan, owner of North Washington Implement in the 1940's and 50s, knew the tractor would be valuable some day and kept it at the dealership rather than selling. During a Germany Stihl factory tour in 1990s, Jim noticed a Stihl tractor on display. He wanted to buy the tractor but the Germans didn't want to sell. Stihl tractors were produced in Germany from 1948 to 1960. Stihl found a 1948 model and shipped it to Jim. That was the first Stihl tractor to make it to North America. Other tractors owned are models 4020, 1020 pink, 2510, 2155, 710, 990, 4320 and a 400c dozer. The

**Meeting called to order** at 7:12 PM by Paul Hieb pres. Minutes of previous meetings read and approved.

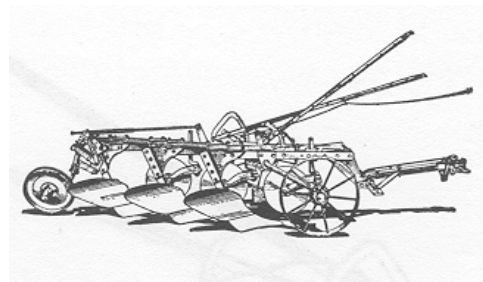
**Treasurers Report:** \$3081.12 on hand. We still have 35 unpaid members for 2019.

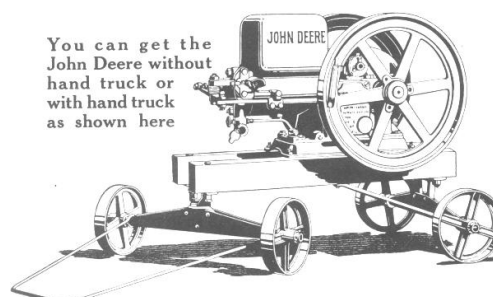

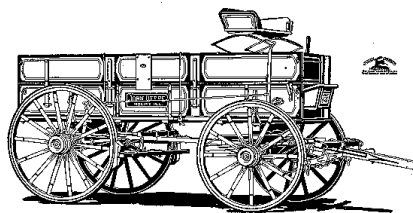
