## Northwest Washington Two Cylinder EXPO VIII

It's happening this August 4 to 7, 2010 at Berthusen Park, Lynden, WA. It's the year of the Deere at the annual Puget Sound Antique Tractor and Machinery Association show and the feature John Deere will be the model M, related implements and Deere stationary engines.

This is the perfect opportunity to revive the Northwest Two Cylinder EXPO series in conjunction with the annual P.S.A.T.&M.A. show. The Cascade Two Cylinder Club will be hosting the Northwest Washington Two Cylinder EXPO VIII event with the help of the Rainier Two Cylinder Club, Southwest Two Cylinder and Columbia River Two Cylinder Club.

The EXPO VIII schedule of events will include seminars, special John Deere tractor pull, slow race, daily parade and a potluck dinner. A "live display" of operating Deere implements is being planned and space will be available for individual Two Cylinder club booths. Vendors specializing in John Deere parts and services have been invited. Camping will be allowed on site and free parking will be provided in the west field area for cars, trucks and trailers. A shuttle will be available to move people from the parking area to the east show grounds.

We need your help in exhibiting as many John Deere M, MT, MI and MC tractors as possible. The MT model comes in the tricycle, single front wheel and wide front end and we

would like to see as many of these variations as possible. We are also encouraging displays of the M series integral implements such as mowers, disks, plows, planters, fertilizer attachments. In addition to the tractors, we are requesting displays of John Deere stationary engines such as the Model E(1 1/2 h.p., 3 h.p. and 6 h.p.), Waterloo engines and the free standing John Deere power units (W-42, W-111 and W-112). We are also looking for the "LU" series stationary engines used on combines and the free standing power plants.

Nicely restored equipment draws the most attention but clean equipment in its "working clothes" has a special attraction also.

If you don't have a model M series tractor then bring your classic two cylinder tractor or new generation Deere.

The past Northwest Washington Expos have attracted over 180 Deeres and we hope to reach that exhibition number again. We have a little over six months until show time so now is the time to get started!

## Tools Explained

### Part 1

**Vice-Grips:** Generally used after pliers to completely round off bolt heads. If nothing else is available, they can also be used to transfer intense welding heat to the palm of your hand.

**Oxyacetylene Torch:** Used almost entirely for lighting various flammable objects in your shop on fire. Also handy for igniting the grease inside the wheel hub out of which you want to remove a bearing race.

**Table Saw:** A large stationary power tool commonly used to launch wood projectiles for testing wall integrity.

**Hydraulic Floor Jack:** Used for lowering an automobile to the ground after you have installed your new brake shoes, trapping the jack handle firmly under the bumper.

**Band Saw:** A large stationary power saw primarily used by most shops to cut good aluminum sheet into smaller pieces that more easily fit into the trash can after you cut on the inside of the line instead of the outside edge.

**Two-Ton Engine Hoist:** A tool for testing the maximum tensile strength of everything you forgot to disconnect.

**Philips Screwdriver:** Normally used to stab the vacuum seals under lids or for opening old-style paper and tin oil cans and splashing oil on your shirt: but can also be used, as the name implies, to strip out Phillips screw heads.

**Straight Screwdriver:** A tool for opening paint cans. Sometimes used to convert common slotted screws into non-removable screws and butchering your palms.

**Pry Bar:** A tool used to crumple the metal surrounding that clip or bracket you needed to remove in order to replace a 50 cent part.

**Minutes** of previous meeting read and approved

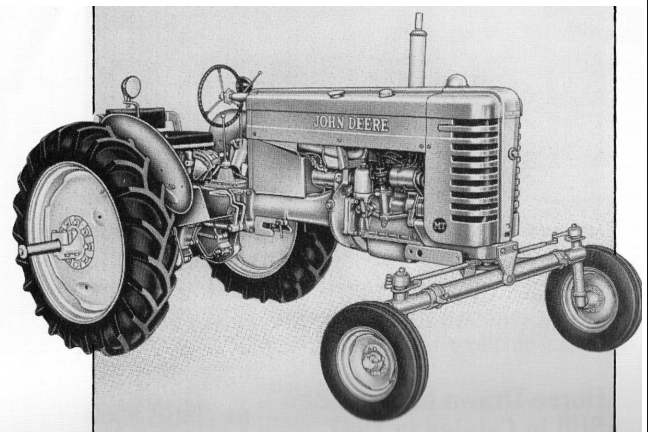

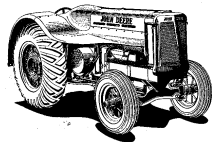
**Hose Cutter:** A tool used to make hoses too short.

**Hammer:** Originally employed as a weapon of war, the hammer nowadays is used as a kind of divining rod to locate the most expensive parts adjacent the object we are trying to hit.

**Utility Knife:** Used to open and slice through the contents of cardboard cartons delivered to your front door: works particularly well on contents such as seats, vinyl records, liquids in plastic bottles, collector magazines, refund checks, and rubber or plastic parts. It is especially usefully for slicing work clothes, but only while in use.

**Damm-It Tool:** Any handy tool that you grab and throw across the garage while yelling "Damm\_It" at the top of your lungs. It is also, most often the next tool that you will need.

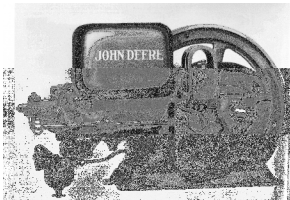
