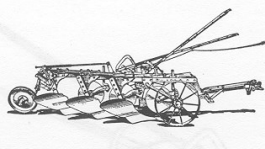

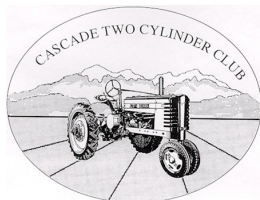

David Harrison, Family Pa- sion for Deeres

The hobby for me started as a family hobby. My dad got us started and now my brother, his son and I are all involved in the hobby. We each have our individual collections so it has become more of a personal hobby with a family beginning.

My best recollection of my beginning to collect tractors was in 1993. My dad had a 1937 Unstyled A that he offered me to get started. At the time I didn't have the money to buy it so he offered me the opportunity to "work it off" on the farm and so that became the first John Deere I owned. At the same time my dad offered to pay my first year's dues in the Cascade Two Cylinder Club to get me started so I joined and have maintained a membership until the present. I am currently serving on the board of directors for the club.

Current collection

I currently own eight John Deere tractors. They are: JD Model L, JD Styled A, JD Model BN, JD Model 40 Standard, JD Model 520, JD Model 720, JD Model 2020, and JD Model 4020. The oldest in my collection is the Styled A and the newest is the 4020.

I only have one fully restored tractor and that is the John Deere 520. It was restored at Barnett Implement and I purchased it from Jerry Rindal. At one time, I had visions of restoring a tractor, but came to the realization that this just wasn't going to happen so I decided to buy the 520 mostly for showing in the parades and at shows. I consider myself to be one who preserves tractors rather than restoring them.

I believe the rarest tractor I own is the 1970 JD 4020. That might sound odd, but mine is a gas model. According to the Mr. Thinker Almanac, there were only 220 gas models produced out of 13,027 total 4020's from that year. The BN is also pretty rare; I don't know the model year for sure, but looking through the production numbers, there were not a lot of BN's produced.

My Favorite Tractor

If you ask me which tractor is my favorite I would say that I have two favorites. The first one is the 1958 JD 720 Diesel. It is one of my favorites because it was on our farm when

I was growing up and I logged "a few" hours driving it on our farm. My other favorite is my 1970 JD 4020. I remember when the New Generation tractors came out and even though I was raised with all two-cylinder tractors, I just thought these were the best-looking tractors I had ever seen, they still are in my opinion. I have seen articles written that indicate that the JD 4020 was arguably the best tractor ever built. My first opportunity to drive one was when I was in high school and I worked on one of the last two stationary Pea Viner sets near Edison. For two seasons I drove one of the two "stack tractors". I believe the tractor may have been a 2010 or 2020 diesel with dual rear wheels.

Origins

Some of my the tractors are from out of the area and some from Skagit County. The 720 Diesel was one of our original farm tractors that was used on our farm and was a local tractor originally came from Barnett Implement; my dad was the second owner of the tractor. I bought the 40 Standard from a farmer near Ellensburg and the 4020 was also a tractor that came from eastern Washington.

Satisfaction

I think the feature I like best about tractor collecting is the chance to "rescue" and preserve these antique tractors. I have an oversell passion for preserving the past, so collecting fits right in with my passion. I do most of my own mechanical work. I have shown some of my tractors in various parades and I have shown some of them at the PSAT&MA show at Lynden. I even tried my 520 in a slow race. I wasn't "slow enough".

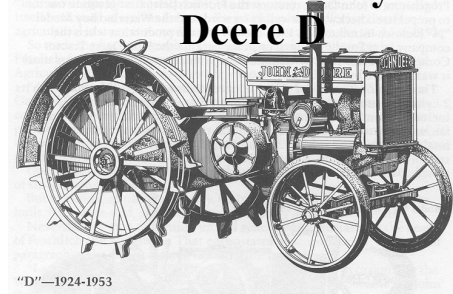

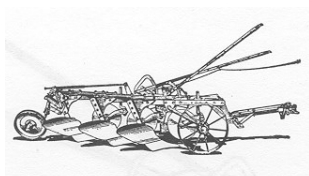

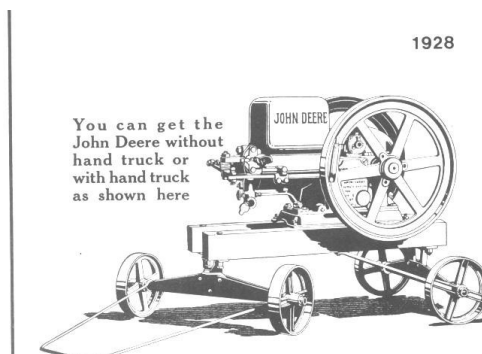
